BIOGRAPHIES

Panel One: Multijurisdictional Merger Control

- Dr. Yong Huang (Panelist): Dr. Huang is the Director of the Competition Law Center of the University of International Business & Economics (“UIBE”). He is currently a member of the Expert Advisory Board of China’s State Council Anti-Monopoly Commission. When China began drafting Anti-Monopoly Law, he advised the government and lawmakers throughout the process: first as a member of the Advisory Board for the State Council, and later an advisory expert for the Legal Committee of the National People’s Congress. Dr. Huang has been entrusted by a variety of governmental and legislative bodies in China: he serves as the Anti-Monopoly Law expert advisor for the National Development and Reform Commission of China (“NDRC”), the Ministry of Commerce of China (“MOFCOM”), the State Administration for Industry and Commerce of China (“SAIC”), and so forth.
- Ms. Janet McDavid (Panelist): Ms. McDavid, a partner at Hogan Lovells US LLP, is widely known as an authority in antitrust law. She is a Co-Chair of the International Bar Association Antitrust Committee (2016 & 2017) and a former Chair of the ABA Antitrust Section (1999 to 2000). She has provided antitrust transition guidance to the Obama, Bush, and Clinton Administrations, and provided antitrust advice to the U.S. Department of Defense. Her practice focuses on antitrust investigations, merger review, and antitrust policy issues. Ms. McDavid is also a frequent speaker on antitrust issues around the globe; she has authored and co-authored many books involving antitrust law. Chambers praised Ms. McDavid as “‘the cream of the crop’ with ‘one of the best reputations at the antitrust bar.’”
- Dr. Howard A. Shelanski (Panelist): Dr. Shelanski is a partner at Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP and a Professor at Georgetown University Law Center. He was the Administrator of the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs at the White House from 2013 to 2016. From 2012 to 2013, he served as the Director of the Bureau of Economics at the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”), where he supervised the FTC’s economic analysis. He also served, from 2009 to 2011, as the Deputy Director of the Bureau; in that position, he was responsible for the Bureau’s antitrust portfolio, contributed to the revision of the Horizontal Merger Guidelines, and was involved in various major investigations. From 1999 to 2000, he served as the Chief Economist of the Federal Communications Commission, and from 1998 to 1999, he was a Senior Economist to the President’s Council of Economic Advisers at the White House.
- Ms. Catriona Hatton (Panelist): Ms. Hatton is the partner in charge of the Brussels office and the Co-Chair of the Global Antitrust and Competition Law Group of Baker Botts LLP. Her practice focuses on European Union (“EU”) competition law. She has extensive experience advising on EU and national competition law aspects of international mergers, including filings under the EU Merger Regulation and coordinating global merger filings. She is also the Co-Chair of the International Bar




Association's Merger Working Group. She was named one of the leading "100 Women in Antitrust" by Global Competition Review in 2009, 2013, and 2016.

- Dr. Xin (Roger) Zhang (Panelist): Dr. Zhang is an Antitrust Consultant in the Beijing Office of East & Concord Partners. He advises international and Chinese clients on merger-control matters, compliance programs, government investigations, civil-litigation matters, and so forth. As an expert in competition law, he participated in the drafting and the commenting of guidelines, administrative regulations and other implementation documents issued by State Administration for Industry and Commerce of China ("SAIC") and National Development and Reform Commission of China ("NDRC"), and conducted multiple research projects on the legislation for both authorities. A Fulbright Scholar, he also conducted research in competition law under the guidance of Mr. William E. Kovacic, the former FTC's Chairperson.
- Dr. Valeria Losco (Moderator): Dr. Losco is a legal consultant in the Antitrust, Competition and Trade Group of Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer LLP. She advises clients on a range of antitrust issues, including the U.S. merger control and review process, multijurisdictional merger control. She also represents clients before the Federal Trade Commission and the U.S. Department of Justice. Dr. Losco is also an Adjunct Professor of Law at the Georgetown University Law Center, where she teaches International and Comparative Antitrust.

Panel Two: International Conduct Enforcement Cooperation

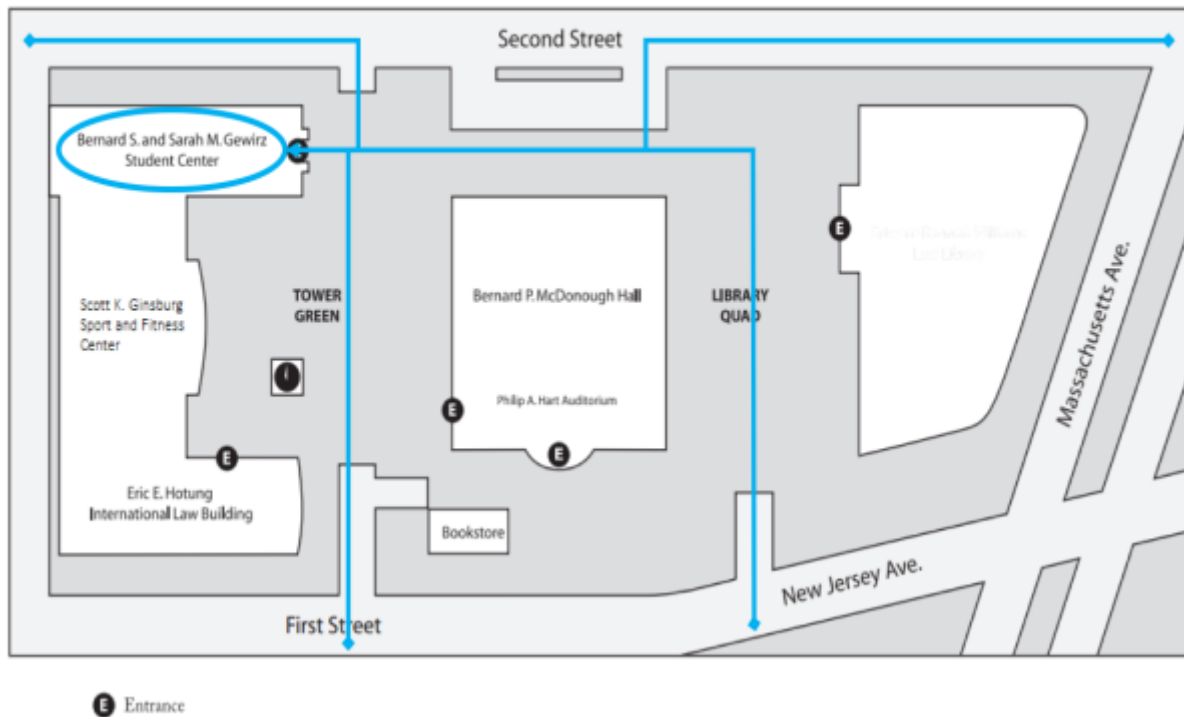
- Mr. Brent Snyder (Panelist): Mr. Snyder currently serves as the Acting Assistant Attorney General in the Antitrust Division of the United States Department of Justice. He has served in the Antitrust Division since 2003: he was a Trial Attorney in the Antitrust Division's National Criminal Enforcement Section and in its San Francisco Office from 2003 until 2013. He has been a Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Criminal Enforcement since 2013. Mr. Snyder has played a key role in some of the Antitrust Division's most important recent investigations and trials, including thin-film transistor liquid crystal display panels, coastal water freight, and air transportation. Mr. Snyder has twice received the Attorney General's Award for Distinguished Service for his work.
- Dr. Hiroyuki Odagiri (Panelist): Dr. Odagiri, a Commissioner of Japan Fair Trade Commission ("JFTC") from 2012 to 2016, now serves as a Special Advisor to the JFTC. From 2008 to 2012, he was the Director of Competition Policy Research Center ("CPRC") at Japan Fair Trade Commission. From 2001 to 2004, he was a Director of Research at the National Institute of Science and Technology Policy ("NISTEP") of Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. A distinguished scholar, Dr. Odagiri taught at Oberlin College in the United States, University of Tsukuba, Hitotsubashi University, and Seijo University. He also has ample research experience globally, *e.g.*, in Germany from 1982 to 1983, and in the United Kingdom from 1988 to 1990.

- Dr. Kai Zhu (Panelist): Dr. Zhu, a Director at the Price Supervision & Anti-Monopoly Bureau of the National Development & Reform Commission of China (“NDRC”), currently coordinates the NDRC’s international cooperation. He also participated in drafting China’s Fair Competition Review System, investigating multiple NDRC’s Anti-Monopoly cases, and conducting pertinent policy research.
 - Ms. Aimee Imundo (Panelist): Ms. Imundo is the Global Executive Counsel, Competition Law & Policy, for General Electric Company (“GE”). Her practice includes responsibilities for counseling, transactions, litigations, investigations, training and compliance on a global basis. Before this role at GE, she was the Associate General Counsel for Antitrust at the GE Capital, the financial services business of GE. Before joining GE, she practiced at Arnold & Porter, where she worked primarily on antitrust litigations and transactions. Ms. Imundo has twice been named one of the “100 Women in Antitrust” by Global Competition Review magazine. She has served in several leadership positions in the ABA Antitrust Section and is a frequent speaker at antitrust law conferences on international topics.
 - Ms. Rachel Brandenburger (Panelist): Recognized as a leading international antitrust and competition law and policy advisor with many years of experience around the world, Ms. Brandenburger is licensed as a foreign legal consultant in New York and admitted as a solicitor in England and Wales. She became a Senior Advisor & Foreign Legal Consultant to Hogan Lovells US LLP in 2014, based in New York. From 2010 to 2013, Rachel was Special Advisor, International to the Antitrust Division of the U.S. Department of Justice. She advised on many Antitrust Division matters that involved extensive cooperation efforts between the Antitrust Division and its international counterparts. Before that, Ms. Brandenburger was a partner for 21 years with Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer LLP, in its Brussels and London offices. Ms. Brandenburger is a Non-Governmental Advisor to the International Competition Network, and a member of the Advisory Board of the American Antitrust Institute and of the Friends of the British Council. She is also a member of the International Task Force of the American Bar Association’s Section of Antitrust Law. Ms. Brandenburger has been appointed to a 2017 Visiting Law Fellowship at St. Hilda’s College, University of Oxford.
 - Mr. Paul O’Brien (Moderator): As a Counsel in the Office of International Affairs, Mr. O’Brien currently coordinates the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”)’s participation in the International Competition Network (“ICN”). He joined the FTC in 2012 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Antitrust Division’s Foreign Commerce Section. At the Antitrust Division, he was responsible for ICN participation and other aspects of international policy. He also previously served as a Special Assistant to the Directors of Enforcement in the Division.
